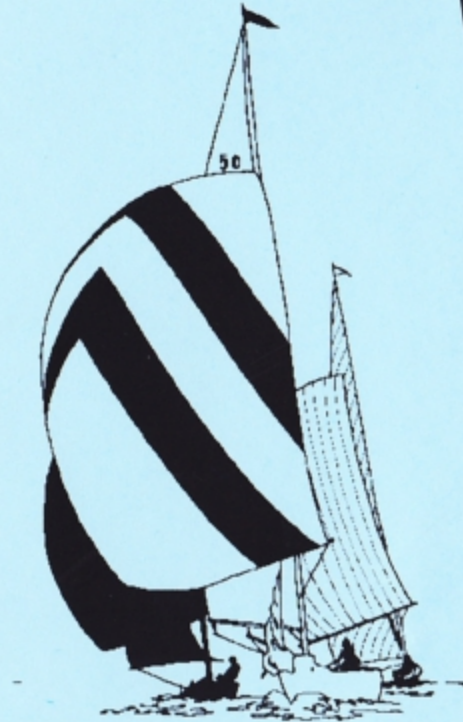

COLLINS BAY MARINA NEWS

Many thanks to the Club for the beautiful Calla Lily plant given to us in celebration of Mya's birth. We have been touched by the warmth and caring shown by so many of you at this special time of our lives. Thanks to all.

We would like to mention the Easter Seals Regatta which will take place Saturday, June 26 at KYC. A popular event for cruisers and racers alike, the Easter Seals Regatta is a lot of fun and generates a significant donation to a worthy cause - handicapped kids. What about the low water situation? At this stage, we are 90% sure that we will undertake a major dredging project this summer. First we will dredge the channel to a depth of at least 10' at low water. Then we'll dredge the area between the breakwall and C-dock to accommodate a new B-dock. Finally, we'll do some cleanup work at haulout slips and the east end. Dumpsites are

secured, equipment plan is in place, dredging permit processing is underway and we are tackling the tough part: financing (any donations?). We will keep you posted.

Note that the International St. Lawrence River Board of Control will be holding a public meeting regarding water levels on June 2, 7:00 - 9:30 pm at the Cornwall Civic Complex, 100 Water Street East, Cornwall, Ontario. Let us know if you plan to go. If there are enough people, we'll organize a bus.

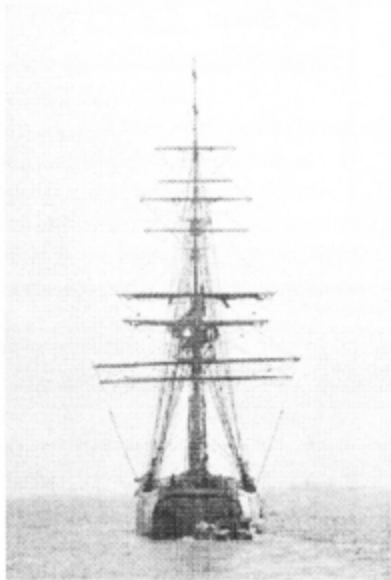

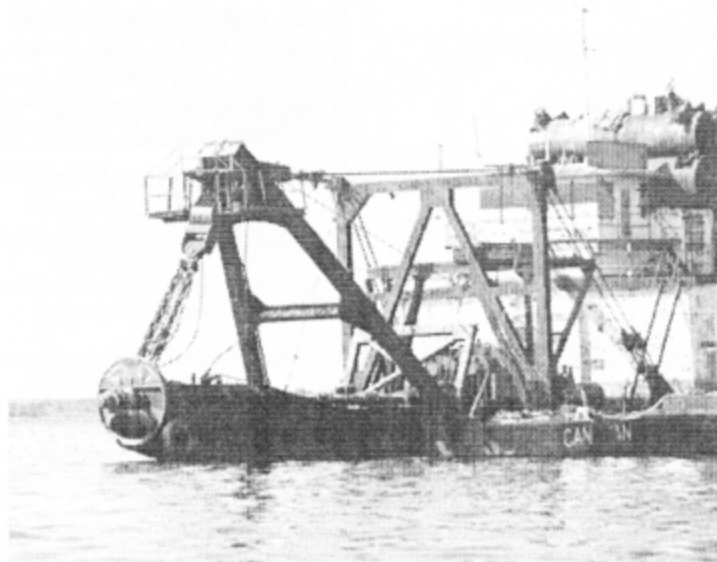
